# MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRWOMAN AND THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Dear Members, Stakeholders, Colleagues and Readers,

This Annual Report 2024 outlines the key achievements over the year and the ongoing evolvement of LuxFLAG as a key player in the sustainable investment ecosystem as an independent label for funds and other financial products, verified by an internal team of experts, supported by dedicated Eligibility Committees. Among the highlights:

- Announcing the launch of the Social Impact Label, scheduled to award the first funds in early 2025.

The number of investment products labelled by LuxFLAG remains stable between the year 2023 and the year 2024, as well as the distribution of labelled investment products among the labels. The ESG Label represents 65% of all labelled products.

LuxFLAG Applicant Fund Status (AFS) aims at granting labels to investment products that are still in the phase of raising funds. Among the 43 newly labelled investment products, 30% were in this phase.

The data shows mixed trends in Assets Under Management (AUM) across investment labels from 2023 to 2024, with an overall increase of 6% (from 1,497 to 1,573 billion). Climate Finance remained stable with a slight drop of -0.5%. The Environment Label saw a sharp decline of -26% (from 453 to 335 billion), mainly due to the withdrawal of an applicant with exceptionally high AUM. In contrast, the ESG Label grew by +11% (from 526 to 584 billion), and Microfinance saw the largest rise at +42% (from 330 to 467 billion), reflecting strong investor interest in social and sustainable impact.

The table highlights a clear distinction in asset allocation between Impact Label and ESG Label holders. Impact Label holders specifically those under Climate Finance, Microfinance, and Environment—primarily invest in private assets, with full allocation (100%) for the first two and 63% for Environment. A significant portion of these are directed toward private debt, indicating a focus on direct, often long-term financing to drive impact. In contrast, ESG Label holders predominantly invest in listed assets, with 73% allocated to listed debt and equity. This suggests a broader, more liquid market approach to sustainable investing within ESG strategies

The table outlines the strategies adopted by ESG-labelled funds, revealing a diverse and active approach to responsible investing. Notably, 81% of these funds engage with investee companies—through voting, direct dialogue, or collective efforts—to influence positive environmental, social, and governance outcomes. Additionally, 23% align with specific Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), using defined methodologies to measure their contribution. Thematic investing is present in 20% of funds, focusing on trends such as climate action, inclusive growth, or education. Meanwhile, 16% explicitly aim to generate climate and/or social impact. Interestingly, all non-ESG label holders also apply ESG, thematic, impact investing, and engagement strategies, suggesting a broader industry shift toward sustainability beyond label distinctions.







# ISAE 3000 TYPE II CERTIFICATION

In 2024 LuxFLAG had once again secured the International Standard on Assurance Engagements certification (ISAE 3000 Type II) from EY Luxembourg for the period from January 1 st to December 3 l st, 2024.

This certification underscores LuxFLAG's commitment to transparency and excellence in its label issuance process for sustainable financial products. EY Luxembourg performed a report on LuxFLAG's process of label issuance services to sustainable finance investment products.

LuxFLAG has maintained this certification since January 2019, distinguishing itself as a pioneer and leader in the sustainable finance sector. LuxFLAG's consistent achievement of the ISAE 3000 Type II certification demonstrates its dedication to upholding the highest international standards, which sets LuxFLAG apart from its peers. It is a demonstration of LuxFLAG's solid business model, operating effectiveness, and credibility, which are reinforced by both internal and external verification.

The ISAE 3000 Type II certification provides stakeholders with enhanced transparency into LuxFLAG's label issuance processes, validated by an independent third-party. As an internationally recognized standard, ISAE 3000 not only raises the bar for label issuance but also sets a new benchmark for best practices within the financial industry.

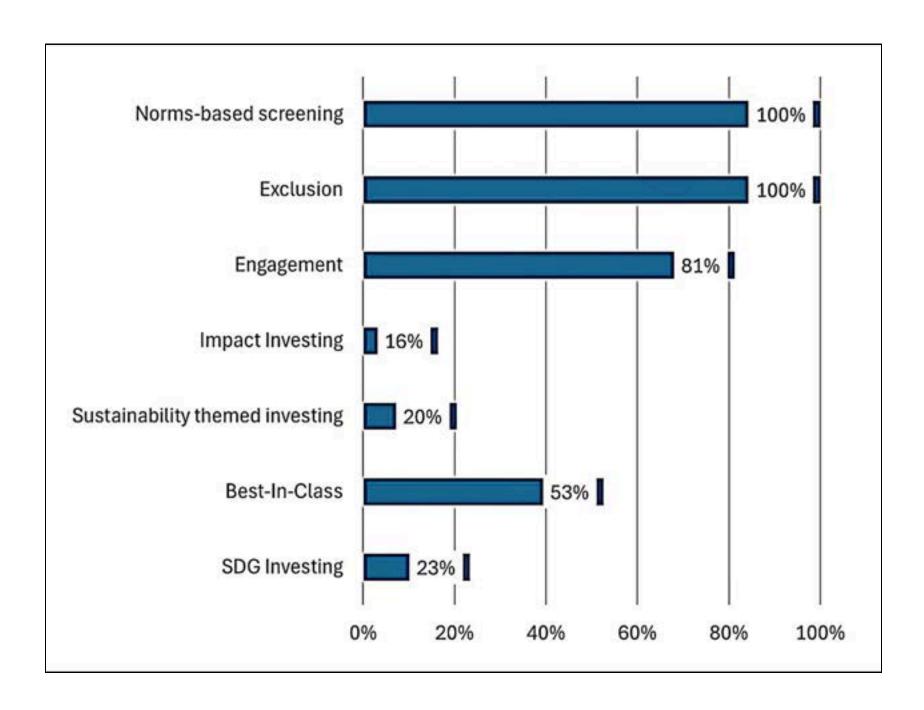






# FUND AND STRATEGY BREAKDOWN

ESG Strategies applied by LuxFLAG ESG labelled funds



The table illustrates the range of responsible investment strategies employed by ESG Label holders. Universally, 100% apply norms-based screening and exclusion, indicating a baseline commitment to avoiding investments that violate international standards or ethical principles. Engagement is used by 81% of funds, reflecting a strong emphasis on active stewardship. More targeted strategies show varied uptake: best-inclass selection is applied by 53%, favoring companies with superior ESG performance. Meanwhile, SDG investing (23%), sustainability-themed investing (20%), and impact investing (16%) are used by a smaller share, highlighting more specialized approaches to aligning investments with long-term sustainable outcomes.

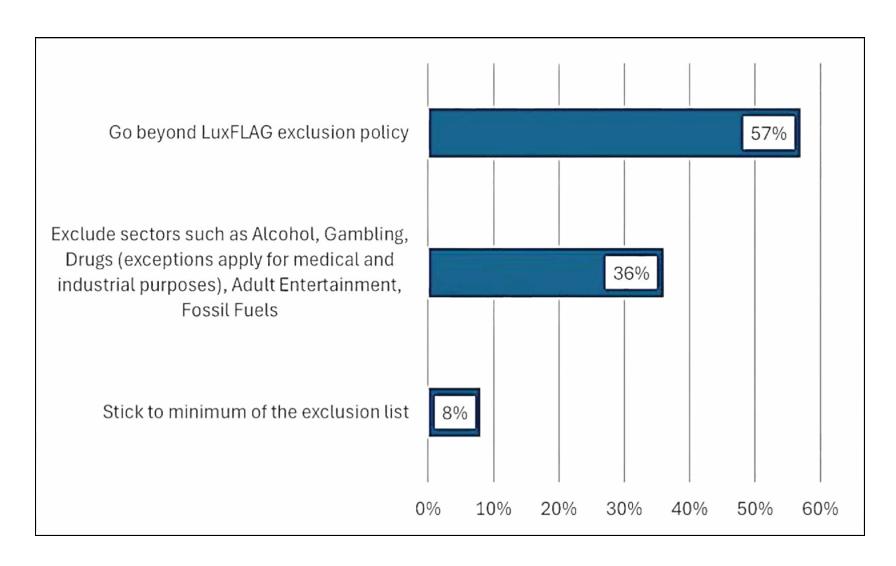






# FUND AND STRATEGY BREAKDOWN

### ESG Strategies applied by LuxFLAG ESG labelled funds



The table reveals varying levels of exclusion criteria among ESG-labelled investment products. Only 8% apply exclusions limited to controversial behaviors, jurisdictions, weapons, and tobacco, following the basic LuxFLAG ESG Exclusion Policy. A larger portion, 36%, extends exclusions to additional sectors like alcohol, gambling, drugs, adult entertainment, and fossil fuels. The majority, 57%, go even further by excluding sectors and activities beyond those outlined in the LuxFLAG policy. This range highlights differing levels of stringency in ESG screening, reflecting varied investor priorities and interpretations of responsible investment standards.





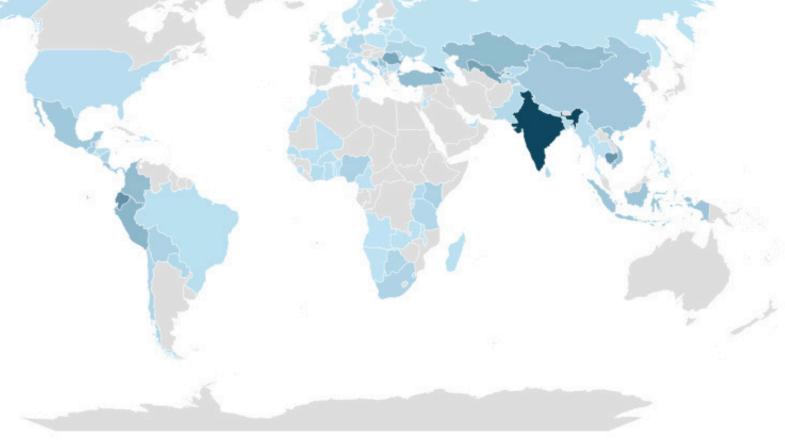

The table highlights the top countries receiving microfinance investments from Microfinance labelled funds, with India leading at 10%. Other notable recipients include Georgia (7%), Ecuador and Cambodia (both 5%), and Uzbekistan, Romania, and Armenia (each 4%). Peru, Bosnia, and Kazakhstan each attract around 3% of microfinance funds. This distribution reflects a focus on emerging and developing markets across Asia, Eastern Europe, and Latin America, where microfinance plays a key role in supporting financial inclusion and local economic development.

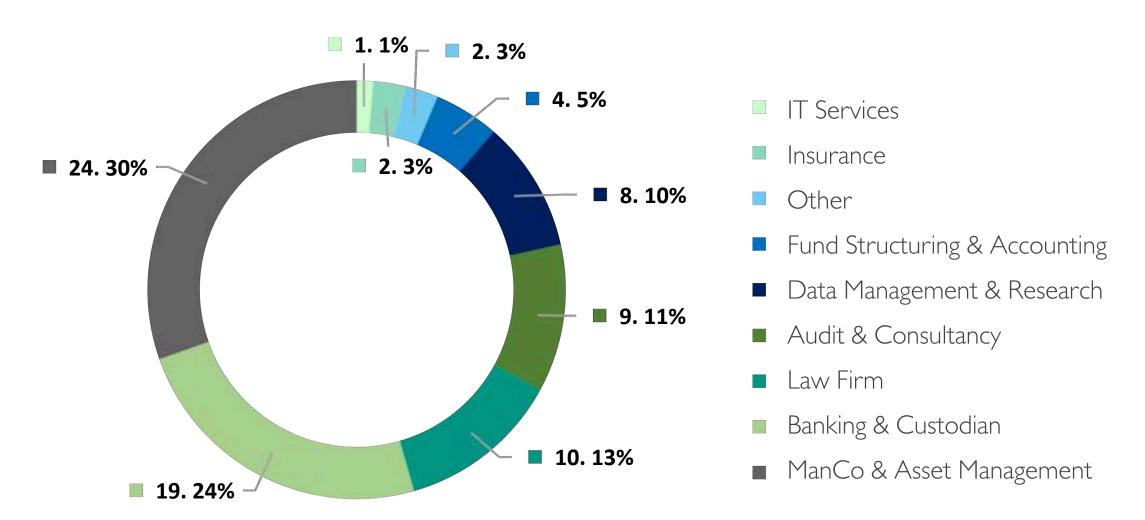

### Strengthening our impact: Events, engagements and strategic partnerships

In 2024, LuxFLAG reinforced its commitment to fostering knowledge sharing and collaboration within the sustainable finance ecosystem. This year marked the **launch of LuxFLAG's quarterly activity overview**, providing Associate Members with a structured and transparent account of recurring events, initiatives, and key developments.

## Delivering value through proprietary events

LuxFLAG continued to prioritize **high-quality**, impactful event execution for its **Associate Members, partners** and the wider audience. In 2024, we successfully hosted **11 proprietary events**, offering thought leadership, expert insights, and networking opportunities tailored to the evolving needs of sustainable finance professionals. These events underscore our commitment to fostering meaningful discussions and supporting the industry's transition towards more responsible investment practices.

A key highlight was the LuxFLAG Sustainable Investment Week 2024 (LSIW24), which successfully took place and welcomed more than 260 attendees over two afternoons from across the sustainable finance ecosystem. ## Expanding knowledge sharing and industry engagement

# **LUXFLAG SUSTAINABLE INVESTMENT WEEK 2024**

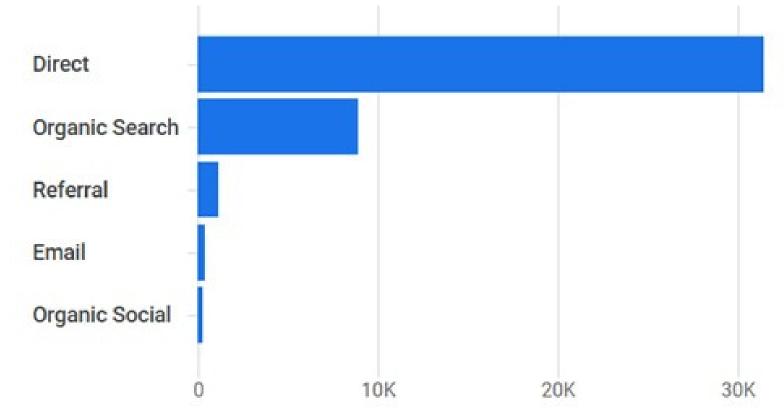
